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FROM OUR CEO

Recently, someone asked me an interesting question: What is my EduCare *why*? In other words, what is it that drives my dedication to this organization? My answer was: I am grateful every day to have the opportunity to serve. I am passionate about creating environments where youth cannot just survive, but thrive and flourish.

As I grow into my new role as Chief Executive Officer, I am also grateful to be working with such an outstanding team of experienced, energetic, and enthusiastic individuals, all fully dedicated to EduCare's mission.

Strengthening our foundation

2024-2025 was a transition year for EduCare. We experienced significant growth in the number of students and schools served. As a result, we added 259 new staff members – and it became clear that we needed to focus on essential HR resources to support our expanding staff.

Our terrific HR department, led by its new senior manager, is upleveling staff communications as well as updating organization-wide policies and automating basic procedures, so our staff can spend more time focusing on students, not on paperwork. Our internal Professional Development training includes all staff members, from front-line school staff to coordinators, managers, and administrative staff members.

As we grow, it becomes even more essential to create a strong internal structure, encouraging greater, more effective collaboration across our organization. Redefined leadership teams have allowed ACE Initiative and ACE Programs, Afterschool/Expanded Learning, and Specialized Student Support Services personnel to actively communicate with one another – and as a result, enthusiasm, ideas generated, and energy have all exploded!

Following their annual retreat, our Board of Directors strengthened EduCare's foundation by revitalizing existing Board committees to focus on governance, innovation, and growth.

Responding to community challenges

One of EduCare's key strengths is our dedication to encouraging, supporting, and uplifting the lives of young people. Another is agility – our ability to respond quickly to whatever situation may arise.

Two serious environmental challenges arose this year. In January, fires and serious windstorms ravaged large parts of Los Angeles and Altadena, disrupting life for thousands of people (including staff members, as well as many educational partners and school personnel), and directly impacting students with school closures.

More recently, ICE began operations in Southern California, causing anxiety for many families, including those of our staff and students.

In each case, our staff has stepped up magnificently, not only providing resources and emotional support, but demonstrating to our young people how to stay resilient, even thrive, in the face of life-changing challenges.

Ready for greater growth

Every change we have made during this year has been intentional and strategic. It is essential that EduCare maintain the outstanding quality of our programs and services, while preparing for ongoing growth.

Behind the scenes, we have been exploring the elements essential for achieving the vision plan outlined in *A Million Bright Lights*. We have also been developing key partnerships needed to achieve our goal of bringing Heartset® Education to millions of young people around the nation and around the world.

There are so many to thank. I am grateful for the unconditional support and hard work of our Leadership Team; for the incredible creativity and dedication of our staff; for the enthusiasm of our educational partners; and for the generous support of our many donors, both institutional and individual.

EduCare had another incredible year, and our future is bright. Let's continue to encourage our young people to reach for and achieve their dreams, as we all continue to grow together!

ACE PROGRAMS

EduCare's nationally recognized program, ACE (Achievement and Commitment to Excellence), includes the ACE Program, ACE Initiative, and ACE Heartbeats. Based on EduCare's Heartset® principles, and decades of expertise in social-emotional learning (SEL), ACE provides a foundation for safe, positive learning and growth, as well as comprehensive student success and character building.

Our flagship **ACE Program** is an evidence-based, immersive SEL experience that strengthens students' confidence, empathy, and leadership skills. Offered as a three-day program or a one-day intensive workshop, ACE engages students, teachers, and staff in dynamic, hands-on activities that build schoolwide connection and belonging.

Independent evaluations confirm: ACE fosters empathy, improves student engagement, and creates inclusive school environments where students feel seen, supported, and inspired to achieve their best.

ACE Initiative is a year-round program that incorporates ACE principles throughout a school campus, holistically supporting students in every aspect of school life. Currently embedded in 12 schools, ACE Initiative provides services that strengthen school culture, include families, and support educators in creating meaningful, deeply connected learning environments for young people.

ACE Heartbeats are shorter versions of our ACE Program, focusing on success, character-building skills, and positive school climate and connection.

HEARTSET® PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

EduCare's Heartset® Education Professional Development equips afterschool professionals with the essential skills needed to cultivate self-awareness, personal responsibility, empathy, and compassion.

As a leader in the field of SEL, EduCare actively supports the incorporation of SEL principles into the educational environment to foster kind, compassionate, and effective learning. Interactive workshops, team and trust-building activities, small group discussions, and mindfulness practices combine to enhance and deepen participants' leadership capacity, adaptability, and confidence.

This year, we incorporated more material from *Making the Best of Me** into workshops. We also developed a course focused on weaving the book's principles and techniques into both professional and personal life.

Over 1,000 of our staff members have engaged in Professional Development workshops during 2024-2025, bringing an even deeper appreciation of SEL and Heartset Education to the schools and students we serve.

PARENT & FAMILY SKILLS WORKSHOPS

Parent & Family Skills Workshops add another layer to EduCare's Heartset Education, strengthening parents' confidence in their children's academic and social growth while supporting family-wide stress reduction.

By engaging families through bilingual parent workshops, we extend Heartset skills and valuable self-care practices into the sometimes challenging role of parenting teens.

Activities include relationship building skills, stress management practices, positive discipline, and mindfulness practices. Parents learn practical skills for supporting themselves and their children, making families more resilient.

AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAMS

Since 2009, EduCare has provided high-quality, engaging afterschool, expanded learning, and summer programs that extend the classroom and inspire youth potential.

Conducted within our framework of SEL and Heartset® Education, EduCare's Afterschool Programs wrap around a student's school day to provide academic, enrichment, physical fitness, and social-emotional support. Students develop unique abilities, build positive relationships, and have a more fulfilling educational experience.

EduCare is the largest provider of high school afterschool, expanded learning, and summer programs for the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD). During the 2024-2025 school year, we partnered with 59 elementary, middle, and high schools in LAUSD, Lynwood Unified School District, Green Dot Public Schools, Vaughn Next Century Learning Center, and Birmingham Community Charter High School.

During the past school year, our creative, enthusiastic staff provided students with the opportunities to engage in everything from

robotics, science, and math competitions to journalism, drill team, dance, and meditation. Ukelele? Check. Gardening? Check. English learner enrichment, academic decathlon, college readiness? Check, check, check!

Programs are free of charge for all families, and are offered year-round, including summer.

This year, we strengthened staff capacity and support systems, while maintaining the high quality and impact of our programs.

PECIALIZED STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

EduCare's Specialized Student Support Services include leadership and community service training, case management, English-language learner support, technical coding skills, and substance abuse prevention and intervention.

During the last school year, EduCare managed five student programs we categorize as Specialized Student Support Services. Forty-nine elementary, middle, and high schools across Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) participated in one or more of these programs.

Take Action Campaign (TAC) provides students the opportunity to develop leadership skills by creating and coordinating events to benefit their schools and communities.

Language in Action (LAP) gives students rich opportunities to strengthen English language skills by engaging in language-focused activities, improving self-confidence and increasing school involvement.

Case Management provides comprehensive services for at-risk and English Language Learner (ELL) students, providing them with the opportunity to meet the same academic standards as all other students.

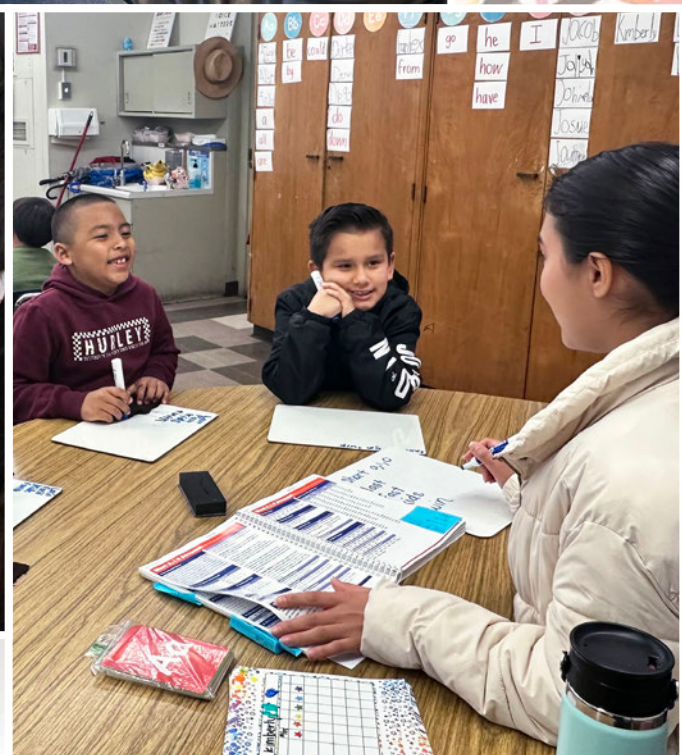
CyberPatriot, a national youth cyber education program created by the Air & Space Forces Association, inspires students about careers in cybersecurity and STEM. The National Youth Cyber Defense Competition challenges teams to secure virtual computer systems against cyber threats.

Tobacco Use Prevention Education (TUPE) encourages students to plan campaign events to inform their peers and community about the harms of tobacco and cannabis use, while supporting them to adopt healthy alternatives.

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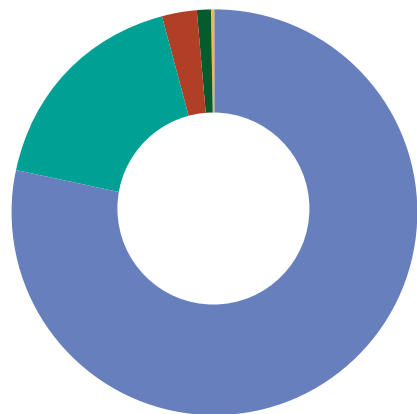

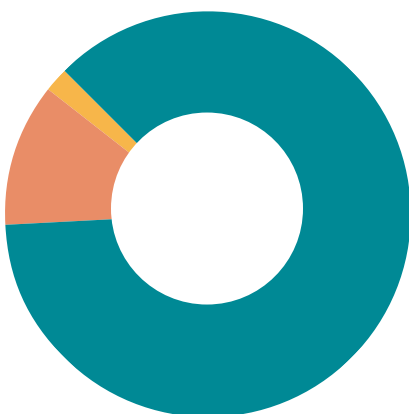

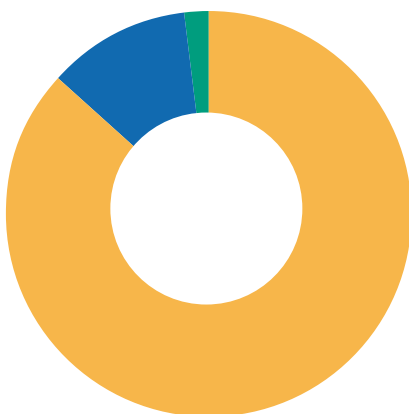
